Presidents Report 2022/23

The 2022/23 year has been a year of growth and success for the club. After years of uncertainty due to COVID and extreme weather Maitland Touch has emerged a bigger, stronger club that has gained the respect of other affiliates within our region.

Our 2022 Junior Competition team numbers were up by a staggering 34 teams from the previous 2021 season reaching our capacity of 113 teams. We had 1055 players between the ages of 7 - 17 playing every Thursday evening from October–December 2022.

Our Senior Summer Competition comprised of 61 teams in total across our women's, men's, and mixed competitions. This is up 21 teams from the previous year.

We have just completed our Mid-Year Competition; we had 17 teams playing in that competition. This was down 2 teams from last year.

We had 7 Senior Representative and 11 Junior Representative teams selected for the 2022/23 respective representative campaigns.

Our senior representative teams competed at our regional tournament at Nelson Bay, our W40 team were crowned champions in their division and the W30 team were runners up with all other teams putting in a strong performance. Country Championships were held at the Central Coast and our combined W40 and W30s team won their division, not all teams attended this tournament, however strong results achieved from those teams who did. Senior State Cup was held at Port Macquarie and 4 of our 7 teams reached the finals series.

Our 14s boys kicked off the Junior Redbacks campaign with a win and being crowned the 14 boys champions at the Don Green Memorial Western Regional Championships in November 22 held in Mudgee. All our teams (12s-18s) played Peter Wilson Memorial Champs at Nelson Bay in February 2023. All teams made the finals series, and our 16 boys were overall champions for their division. For the first time NSW Junior State Cup Northern Conference was held in Dubbo in February 2023, again all teams making it to the final's series and our 14 boys won their division. They, then went to Sydney to play in the State Championships in a best of 3 format. The boys went on to win that and were crowned the overall winners for their division in the State of NSW. This was a wonderful achievement. The last time Maitland Redbacks we crowned NSW Junior State Champions was 24 years ago.

Our representative achievements didn't stop there with a pleasing 27 senior players representing Hornets at national level and an astounding 20 junior Hornets players at regional level that will also be attending NYC later in the year. We also had 4 senior female players play in State of Origin and 5 junior players selected to play at All Schools in Darwin this coming August. To add to this, we will have 3 junior boys play for NSW in CHS, CCC and CIS in Youth titles in September. This growth and these achievements highlight the depth and strength within our club, and that more athletes are choosing touch to be their first sport.

In addition, we had 3 referee upgrades and many coaching upgrades with several MTA members on the coaching staff for Senior and Junior Regional Hornets teams.

Last year I engaged with Maitland City Council applying for a grant to go towards the upgrade of the clubs' amenities. On the night of writing this report I found out that the first step in the process of the major work being carried out starts tomorrow. This will be wonderful for our club as we move forward.

I am truly so grateful to our local community for financially backing Maitland Touch. I would like to thank all our sponsors, our major sponsor Club Maitland City, The Mutual Bank, Nichols Electrical, Carpet Court Maitland, Yellow Coaching, Bakers Delight Green Hills, Lovey's Grocers, CNW Maitland, Pirtek Maitland Branch and Fit4kids for seeing value and worth in our club and what we offer to our community through inclusive sport.



I would like to personally acknowledge and thank all our referees; we have a strong team of referees that work in collaboration with the club at park touch and representative touch level. MTA is fortunate to have the calibre of referees that we can call our own. Thank you to Ivan and Beth for overseeing the referee cohort. You do an amazing job.

Our players/members whether they are a park touch player, a rep player or both, young and old they are our stakeholders. Without them we have no club. I would like to personally thank all our members and our whole touch community for their support. This is my 2nd year as president (in my first year I was acting president), and the growth of our community and the success within our club continues to exceed my expectations. Our stakeholders are the future of this club our growth will bring further success.

To the Committee, we are not large in numbers but large in heart. Thank you for giving your time to our club and our community. Our core business is to play touch football. We desire to play it well and we are setting goals and working on processes to continue to grow our club and lead it to future successes. With our focus and determination, I am excited to see how far we can go. Special mention to our club administrator Hayden, you do so much behind the scenes. I appreciate your knowledge, knowhow, and willingness to always help me and guide our club forward. Thank you for hearing my ideas, sharing my visions, and putting things in place for me (even my crazy ideas). It would be remiss of me not to acknowledge my wonderful husband Steve, who is also the clubs finance guru and my biggest sounding board. His unwavering support is what enables me and allows me to fulfill my role to its fullest, he is the one who grounds me during the crazy times.

In closing I would like to add that Maitland Touch has been nominated for 5 awards at the upcoming NSW Touch Blues Awards night and 4 of our members have also been nominated for personal achievement awards whether that is as a player or service to the sport.

I am thrilled to be the president of this club. What we have achieved in the past 3 years is outstanding. The future of the club is very bright.

Finance Report, Financial Statements

YTD Profit

For the 2022/2023 financial year Maitland Touch have accumulated an operating pre-audit profit (accrual) of \$9,765.45 for the financial year. As noted, this is a pre-audit figure and maybe adjusted once the accountant has looked over them. We are still in a very strong financial position. Profit was down approximately 35% on the previous year which I believe is mainly due to when the sponsorship invoices were distributed (either side of 30 June 2023).

Considerations

We always need to operate in a profitable space in normal operations throughout the yearly cycle. We are in the very fortunate position of having cash reserves which allows us the option to spend in a targeted and responsible way. We always need to have cash reserves and be generally profitable. The current committee hasn't received honorariums and doesn't offer accommodation to committee members for tournaments/awards night. Both of these things this have been offered and paid in the past and could be at any point in the future. This would have notable impact on the bottom line. We are also only just starting (this year) to offer subsidies to representative coaching staff in both junior and senior roles. This will have a substantial impact on our costs or the player levy.

We will discuss the above considerations at upcoming meetings.



Financial Audits

I have the 21/22 and the 22/23 figures prepared for audit now. I will make these available once complete.

Goals for the financial system for the Club in the 21/22 financial year.

- Purchase a second square for uniform/apparel purchases
- Engage a different accountant to assist with streamlining the Xero file
- Agree on an amount to transfer into the term deposit

- First competitions run 'post-pandemic' which saw a significant increase in competing teams from the previous years.
- Unlike previous seasons there were minimal impacts due to weather
- All divisions played relatively competitive touch although early regrades did assist.
- All night supervisors and referees worked well together.

The 2022/23 Summer competition run relatively smoothly however there were a number of serious injuries that needed to be dealt with – either via Ambulance or self-transportation to hospital.

From a competition perspective, the season run smoothly with no major incidents or issues to report.

Mid-year (Winters) Comp 2023

Competition played out across a relatively warm winter with the competition not significantly impacted by weather as previous winter comps had experienced.

This is no doubt the pinnacle event of domestic touch football in Australia showcasing the greatest rivalry between the best players from across Queensland and New South Wales. Hearing that one of Maitland's very own was selected as an official, was simply spectacular. Congratulations to Phil Balcombe who was obviously over the moon to receive such an accolade.



3. **Golden Jubilee Recognition.** NSW Touch recently celebrated 50 years (1972-2022) of touch football by hosting a black tie event at Accor Stadium-Sydney in October 2022. As part of the 50th anniversary celebrations, 'Golden Jubilee' referees were announced. Maitland Touch was overwhelmed when two of our very own referees were named alongside some of the best referees in the history of our sport in NSW which spans five decades. An amazing achievement.
