Please read this booklet carefully

HOW TO REGISTER - (Note: If you are an individual WITHOUT a team, see Page 6)

Maitland Touch Association (MTA) do not accept cash payments for player registrations. Our system is to offer an easy online registration process which can be completed with a credit/debit card.

To [register a team](#), please follow the online registration process at www.maitlandtouch.com.au. NO FEES are charged at this point in the process. Once your team is registered, there are three (3) ways to register your individual players.

- Team manager can add email addresses of their players who will then be sent a link to register.
- Team manager is provided a link (via email) to share with their players to register.
- Individual players can [search for the team](#) name via the link at www.maitlandtouch.com.au on our homepage.

Team managers MUST be over the age of 18. No teams will be accepted with a minor nominated as team manager.

NOTE: Registration fees are paid by each individual player. No fees are charged at the time of team registration.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

For Team Contacts

For MTA to fulfil legal obligations, it is a requirement that **all team contacts and officials** working with children (under 18 years) at a competition under our control complete a **“Working with Children” (WWC) check**.

Follow these steps to apply for a WWC check and receive a WWC number:

Step 1:

Apply for a WWC check by completing the [online application form](#) or visit <https://www.ocg.nsw.gov.au/>.

Step 2:

Once you apply, you will receive an Application (APP) number by email from the Office of the Children’s Guardian.

Step 3:

Attend [your nearest Service NSW](#) and provide your **Application Number** and **Proof of Identification**.

Step 4:

Service NSW will issue a receipt and you will receive your official WWC number within 1-2 weeks.

Step 5:

Provide your WWC number to MTA during the team registration process, or as soon as it is received.

Step 6:

Once MTA have verified your WWC number online, we will advise when you can commence working with children.

PRE-COMPETITION DETAILS

- **ONLINE REGISTRATION and PAYMENTS** can be done via our website 24/7 www.maitlandtouch.com.au
 - **Online team registrations OPEN – Monday 4 August 2025 at 5:30pm.**
 - **Online team registrations CLOSE – Monday 29 September 2025 (or until competitions reach capacity)**
 - **Some competitions reach capacity QUICKLY! Be on time to not miss out.**
- **DRAWS/FIXTURES** can be accessed from the website *after 5:00pm Monday 13 October 2025*.
- Once released and available online, **fixtures WILL NOT be adjusted** unless required by MTA. Any queries around fixtures should be communicated to admin@maitlandtouch.com.au at the time of registration.

REGISTRATION FEES

Fee: \$70 per player (includes playing singlet)

Note: Does not include TFA / NSWTA annual membership (details below)

NO LATE REGISTRATIONS ACCEPTED

- **PLAYER REGISTRATION FEES ARE DUE BY MONDAY 6 OCTOBER 2025**
- Player registration fees are payable online at the time of player registration.
- There are **no additional weekly fees**.
PLEASE NOTE: Registration includes GST, playing singlet, and competition costs.
*Under no circumstances will **refunds** be given to any team/player withdrawing from the competition once draws are complete.*
- Remember – you can use an **Active Kids Voucher** to make up part of your registration.

TOUCH FOOTBALL AUSTRALIA & NSW TOUCH MEMBERSHIP ***NEW*** - \$52.00

From July 1, 2025 – Touch Football Australia (TFA) and NSW Touch Association (NSWTA) implemented their new **annual membership program**.

- When you sign up for your first competition of the financial year through MySideline, you will be prompted to pay an **annual membership fee** of **\$52.00**. This is a one-time, annual fee which covers insurance and affiliation, includes Touch Football Australia membership (\$22.00) and NSW Touch Football membership (\$30.00).
- Once paid, you may register in as many competitions as you like, paying only your competition fees each time you enter. Insurances and affiliation costs have been included in the annual membership fees.
- On 30 June each year your membership will expire and will need to be renewed before registering into a new competition in the new financial year.

AGE ELIGIBILITY

○ Under 7s – Boys and Girls Competitions-	-	Born 2018 to 2020
○ Under 9s – Boys and Girls Competitions-	-	Born 2016 or 2017
○ Under 11s – Boys and Girls Competitions	-	Born 2014 or 2015
○ Under 13s – Boys and Girls Competitions	-	Born 2012 or 2013
○ Under 15s – Boys and Girls Competitions	-	Born 2010 or 2011
○ Under 17s – Boys and Girls Competitions	-	Born 2008 or 2009

- Players ARE permitted to play 'up' a division; however, it is advisable they play in their division/age group as per the guidelines above. Players ARE NOT permitted to play in a division younger than their age.
- No male players are permitted in the female competition from 11 years up. Females are permitted to play in the male competition.

UNDER 7S AND 9S – PLAY FOR FUN POLICY

Maitland Touch Association promotes a “Play for Fun” approach for all Under 7s and Under 9s competitions. These divisions are non-competitive:

- No scores are recorded
- No finals are held
- Coaches/managers assist with refereeing and on-field development
- Modified rules to support learning and enjoyment (e.g. ball dropped = touch made and roll ball)

- A minimum of four (4) players are required to begin a match.

** Based on 2024 rep teams. Team exceeding rep players will not be accepted, or may be moved to an older division.

- **NO TEAM WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT THE REQUIRED MINIMUM NUMBER OF REGISTERED PLAYERS.**
- MTA reserves the right to add additional players to a team if they do not meet the minimum number of registered players.

COMPETITION FORMAT

- Games will be 30 minutes (try - change ends).
- Game times to be confirmed once team registrations close.
- MTA reserve the right to change competition dates as deemed necessary.
- For player insurance purposes, all players must sign-on via QR Code at the fields. QR Code details will be displayed at the playing fields on game days.
- Maitland Touch competitions are held at **Maitland Park - Corner Elgin and Park Streets, Maitland NSW 2320**

DIVISIONS & FINALS ***NEW***

- In 2025, MTA will trial a new system to offer **divisions in larger age groups** where multiple pools are usually required. When registering a team, you will select a preference of **Novice, Intermediate, or Experienced**.
- These selections will serve as a **guideline only** for MTA when forming divisions. Final team placements will depend on the number of registrations and whether multiple divisions are feasible.
- At the conclusion of round games, the **top two teams on the ladder** will go directly into the **Grand Final**.

UNREGISTERED PLAYERS

- Only registered players are allowed to take the field. **No substitutes or fill-ins are permitted.**
- Players **must be registered in each team** they play for. If a player plays for a second team without being registered in it, that team will forfeit the match and may lose competition points at MTA's discretion.

UNIFORMS AND ATTIRE ***UPDATED***

It is the responsibility of each Team Manager to ensure their team complies with all uniform and attire requirements outlined in the rules. Specifically:

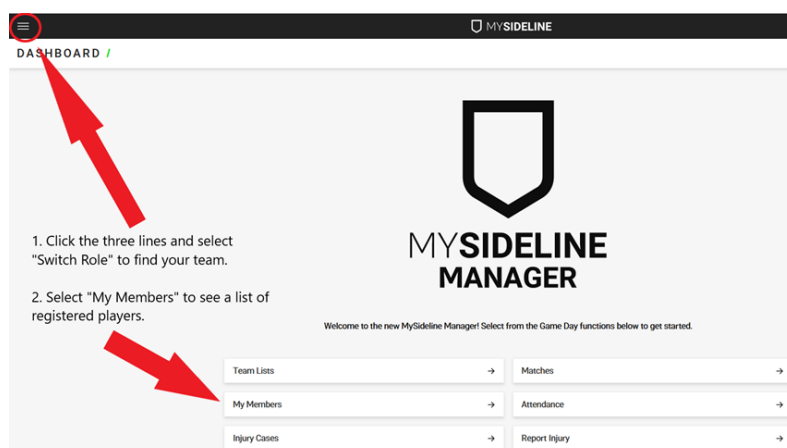
- **Playing Singlets:** Each registered junior participant will receive an official MTA playing singlet. Teams will be assigned a jersey design, and Team Managers will be notified of collection dates and times.
- **Mandatory Use of MTA Singlets:** All teams must wear the provided MTA singlets during games. This requirement is part of our sponsorship agreement and ensures every participant receives a uniform. External jerseys are not permitted.
- **Jewellery & Fingernails:** All jewellery must be removed before play. Fingernails must be short and smooth.
- **Footwear:** Players must wear shoes without screw-in studs or cleats. Acceptable footwear includes joggers and moulded football boots. Metal studs and playing barefoot are strictly prohibited.

Players will get to keep their allocated singlets at the end of the season as a gift from Maitland Touch Association.

TEAM MANAGER ACCESS

After registering, team managers will receive an email to access the [MySideline Manager](#). This allows team managers to check which players are registered, and ensure they meet team number requirements.

NOTE: You will require your usual MySideline login details to access this system. Please remember your details, keep them handy.



REFEREES COURSES

- MTA will aim to conduct a Level 1 (beginners) referee course for those interested.
- Course dates, times, costs, and further details will be posted on our social pages and website.

OFFICIAL REFEREES

- As most members know, we do experience some difficulty obtaining official referees from time to time.
- Various methods have been attempted to attract new referees, all resulting in only minor success. Players are asked to acknowledge without referees the Association would not be as strong and we therefore ask teams to support referees and not abuse them.
- **Severe penalties apply for any player harassing referees in any manner.**
- Anyone wishing to become a referee are asked to see the Director of Referees in the referee's room on any game day/night or contact the Administrator.

FORFEITS

Forfeits can be given for:

- Not having a minimum of four (4) registered players for a game.
- Incorrect uniforms.
- Unregistered players taking part in a match.
- Misconduct or breach of Code of Conduct, by-laws or club rules.

Other forfeit information:

- Teams winning on forfeit will receive 3 competition points and 5-0 for/against win.
- Teams who forfeit games without notice may have the below penalties enforced at MTA's discretion:
 - 1st forfeit – loss of 2 competition points.
 - 2nd forfeit – automatic eviction from competition (no refund of player registration fee).
- Forfeits notified to the competition supervisor will not lose any points. Notification must be received **no later than 1:00pm on game day.**

ADDITIONAL RULES *NEW*

- MTA use the game rules outlined in the [Touch Football Australia 8th Edition Rule Book](#).
- **MERCY RULE: If a team falls behind by 6 points, they may add one extra player to the field.** This player must be removed once the score difference reduces to 4 points.
 - This rule helps balance games between stronger and weaker teams, making matches more enjoyable and supportive of player development.
 - We ask all managers, coaches, and spectators to respect this rule, and encourage all to keep the focus on fun, fairness, and friendship.
- MTA also has by-laws, policies, and procedures that must be followed. These are available on our website and may be updated without notice. They help protect our club and support smooth day-to-day operations.

EXTREME WEATHER

- If extreme weather is present or predicted on game day, please refer to the MTA social media pages for advice on game cancellations.
- MTA reserves the right to re-schedule cancelled games to be played on alternate days if required.

IMAGES

- All persons accept that, by participating at MTA, they may be photographed/filmed and that these images may be used by the MTA for promotion of the sport. The MTA will not pass any image/s onto a third party unless prior approval is sought. If you do not wish the MTA to be able to use your image/s or be filmed, you must notify MTA in writing.
- MTA reserves the right to immediately take possession of any video footage taken at any of our competitions of events that may assist the MTA in investigating any matter of judiciary, discipline, or protest. All care of equipment, tape and data cards will be taken and returned to the owner upon determination of the judiciary, disciplinary hearing, or protest.
